The Medicines Authority was established in 2003 as an autonomous body to contribute to the protection of public health in Malta through the regulation of the safety, quality and efficacy of medicines for sale or supply on the Maltese market and regulation of pharmaceutical activities. The Authority is committed to providing high quality licensing, pharmacovigilance, inspection and enforcement services to its stakeholders for the ultimate benefit of the Maltese general public.

Persons to carry out Maltese Translation Checks

The Medicines Authority is seeking the services of persons to carry out linguistic checks of English-Maltese translations of documents. These documents are related to medicinal products authorised by the European Commission. The Medicines Authority is responsible for ensuring that the translations of these documents, which are of highly technical nature, are of the required quality.

The service is to be carried out in line with requirements set by the Medicines Authority, as stipulated by the European legislation and established guidelines.

The selected persons will be required to enter into a contractual agreement with the Medicines Authority and to abide by rules of strict confidentiality. The Medicines Authority reserves the right to refuse any applications particularly where it considers the possibility of conflict of interest. Proficiency in IT applications (Microsoft® Office particularly Word®) and email is essential.

Services must be in accordance with conditions for contracts for services.
